Class of 2021 Graduation Survey Results

Surveys were administered April 23 – May 28*

Students taking this survey responded to questions about their employment immediately following graduation, utilization of career services, and other questions.

127 students reported on employment status after graduation (percentages reflect this).

Employed

45.67% (n = 58) employed 35 hours a week or more 7.87% (n = 10) employed less than 35 hours a week

Employed and Attending Graduate School

2.36% (n = 3) employed 35 hours a week or more AND enrolled in grad school full-time 2.36% (n = 3) employed 35 hours a week or more AND enrolled in grad school part-time

6.30% (n = 8) employed less than 35 hours a week AND enrolled in grad school full-time 1.57% (n = 2) employed less than 35 hours a week AND enrolled in grad school part-time

Unemployed

25.20% (n = 32) unemployed and looking for a position

Unemployed and Attending Graduate School

6.30% (n = 8) unemployed, looking for a position, AND enrolled in grad school full-time

3.15% (n = 4) unemployed, not looking for a position, AND enrolled in grad school full-time

Volunteer Service Program

1.57% (n = 2) indicated employment was in a volunteer service program

U.S. Military

1.57% (n = 2) indicated employment was with the United States military

Relation to major (n = 112)

Students indicated how related their major is to their post-graduation employment or graduate school status (i.e. employed, unemployed, in graduate school)

62.50% (n = 54) indicated that their occupation or graduate school was "very related" or "somewhat related" to their major.


Satisfaction (n = 112)


